The goals of CTL courses are to focus the many intellectual perspectives and resources of CSU Pueblo on the study of important topics and to enact a sense of common purpose across the diverse communities at CSU Pueblo. These classes are offered to all students: undergraduate, graduate, and professional. Community members may audit these courses for a lowered tuition cost and a certificate of completion; faculty and staff are invited to apply to audit these courses, as room is available, at no cost as ongoing efforts to support professional development utilizing resources readily available on our campus.
